A reminder about dating the books of the NT...

Because of the way they are ordered in the bible Christians often assume that the Gospels were written first, followed by Paul's letters, and then the rest of the letters in the NT.

To best understand who was writing what, and to whom, and for what purpose – it is vital to remember that Paul's letters are the earliest stuff we have from the NT. *Galatians* and *1 Thessalonians* were written probably before the year 50, followed by his other letters as the decade went on. The first gospel written was by Mark, probably in the late 60's; followed by *Matthew* and *Luke* about 15-20 years later, and *John* about 10 years after that.

Luke wrote *Acts* at roughly the same time as his gospel account (c 85). His goal was to tell the story of the earliest church, but as was common with authors of his time he worked hard to smooth over the rough patches, and didn't hesitate to change or ignore unflattering episodes. In this way Luke's 'history' is a very partisan account – more like evangelism than the kind of objective, factual reporting we expect today. (Although hyper-partisan reporting certainly has been making a comeback in some quarters....)
